A graduate of Brown University, O'Day earned a Master of Theological Studies from Harvard Divinity School and a doctorate in New Testament from Emory. She is an ordained minister in the United Church of Christ. She has attained degrees from Brown University, Harvard Divinity School and Emory University.

O'Day taught in the religion department at Hamilton College in Clinton, New York, for a year before becoming assistant professor of New Testament at Eden Theological Seminary, a United Church of Christ seminary in St. Louis, Missouri, in 1983.

She joined the Candler School of Theology faculty as Assistant Professor of Biblical Preaching in 1987, and was appointed the A.H. Shatford Professor of New Testament and Preaching in 1997.

She was Senior Associate Dean of Faculty and Academic Affairs, the chief academic officer for the School of Theology, from 2003 until her appointment to Wake Forest in 2010.
